Gracious

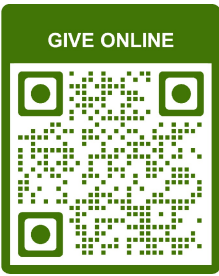
“Pleasant words are a honeycomb, sweet to the soul and healing to the bones.”

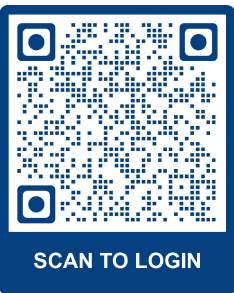
